DIRECTOR'S NOTE

From day one of the Stay-at-Home Order, Palos Park Public Library staff and trustees have been discussing when and how to offer in-person services and access to physical library materials again. Our top priority is and always has been the health and safety of our staff and patrons. We are taking a phased approach to resuming services based on the recommendations and guidelines of government and public health officials. In May we reopened our book drop and two weeks ago we started curbside pickup of library materials to Palos Park Public Library cardholders. Please note that while the library building remains closed, we are very much open. Along with curbside pickup, you can join our online summer reading program, participate in virtual events, download ebooks, stream movies, and get the latest news on our services at www.palosparklibrary.org.

CURBSIDE PICKUP & TELEPHONE SERVICE HOURS





Palos Park Public Library cardholders can request items from the library's collection by placing a hold online in the library catalog, by phone at 708-448-1530, or by email to order@palosparklibrary.org. We will notify you when your items are ready for pickup. During curbside hours pull into one of the pickup spots, call 708-448-1530 or text 708-426-0070, and library staff will bring out your materials and deliver them contact-free by placing them in your trunk or your vehicle's passenger-side window. If you're on foot, contact us when you arrive, wait at the 6-foot distance marker located near the front door, and a staff member will place your items outside on a table. Home delivery is available by request.

Return all library materials to our book drop. Returned items will be quarantined for 7 days prior to being removed from your library account. No overdue fines will be charged. At this time, items may not be picked up at other libraries and interlibrary loan is not available. The library offers this service using protocols to keep patrons and staff safe. Staff have access to personal protective equipment (PPE), including disposable gloves, face masks, hand sanitizer, and disinfectants for handling library items.

We are excited to bring the Summer Reading Program to your home this year through the online platform Beanstack. You can read books from home, books checked out from the library, ebooks, and audiobooks. A Palos Park Public Library card is not required to join. The program is open to all ages.

Children (Babies to 4th Grade) "Get Tagged by Fun and Reading" as they earn digital badges, brag tags, and chances to collect great prizes. Tweens (5th to 8th Grade) earn digital badges, brag tags, and more by tracking reading and participating in virtual events. Adults and Teens earn digital badges, coupons to local stores, and tickets for prize drawings as they travel "Beyond the Page."

Register for the Summer Reading Program on our website at www.palosparklibrary.org starting Monday, June 15. New this year, participants who reach the half way point in the reading goal will receive a special commemorative t-shirt.


Some areas not served by the Palos Park Public Library may receive this mailing because of post office routings.

Call us at 708-448-1530 or email info@palosparklibrary.org to check seed availability. At the end of the growing season "return" your seeds to the library by harvesting seeds from your plant. Patrons will be limited as to how many seeds they can check out as supplies are limited.
